What training will I receive?

Everyone who serves at the center receives four weeks of exclusive training in computers, genealogy, and service plus continuing in-service training while they serve.

What would I do at the center?

- Learn computer and genealogy skills for yourself
- Assist patrons individually to:
 - Enter data in genealogy programs
 - Find ancestors on Internet websites
 - Find ancestors on microfilms and books
 - Submit family pedigrees to FamilySearch
 - Submit family names for temple work
- Help in any of the following other areas:
 - Guest services
 - Lesson design
 - Teaching classes
 - Computer maintenance
 - Web site development
 - Facilities maintenance
 - Sharing our services with the community
 - Indexing our extensive film collection

What skills are needed?

- Good working knowledge of computers
- Interest and some experience in genealogy
- Desire to help others

Who may serve (anyone with an interest)

- Couples, singles, widows or widowers
- College-age, professionals, skilled workers
- Skilled in teaching, lesson development, computers
- Need not be a member of the LDS Church
